## Boardman History

Sam Boardman homesteaded in the area in 1903. In 1917, Umatilla River irrigation water became available, and many homesteaders came to north Morrow County. A small town evolved on the original Columbia River Highway. Most businesses moved when the highway was rebuilt a mile south of the original townsite in 1952.

In the 1960's, Boardman moved south again to avoid the rising lake behind the New John Day Dam. Boardman is now in it's third location.
