

IRRIGON FISH HATCHERY: This hatchery raises steelhead for the Wallowa, Imnaha and Grand Ronde Rivers. It began operation in 1986, fulfilling its present role as a "mothering station" for summer steelhead. Take I-84 East to Exit 168, follow Hwy 730 5.6 miles, turn left onto 8th Rd. Follow signs to hatchery. Irrigon OR 541-922-5732.

COLUMBIA CREST WINERY: Beautiful winery located in Washington's Columbia Valley. This area has a unique combination of soil, climate and latitude, allowing it to produce grapes with full flavor and finesse, much like the worlds most famous wine regions of France. The winery welcomes visitors daily from 10 am to 4:30 pm for tours and tasting. Take I-84 east to I-82. Take the first Washington exit, Hwy 12, go west to Route 221. Turn right on Rt 221 to Columbia Crest Drive, Paterson WA, (509) 875-2061.

PENDLETON UNDERGROUND TOURS: Descend to Pendleton's wild past through tunnels where Chinese laborers are said to have lived and businesses thrived while the west was being settled. At one time, as many as 90 underground passageways, featuring bordellos and speakeasies, thrived below Pendleton streets. Guided tours are available year around, Mon-Sat 9-5, 37 SW Emigrant Ave, Pendleton OR. Please call for ahead for reservations, 800-226-6398 or 541-276-0730.

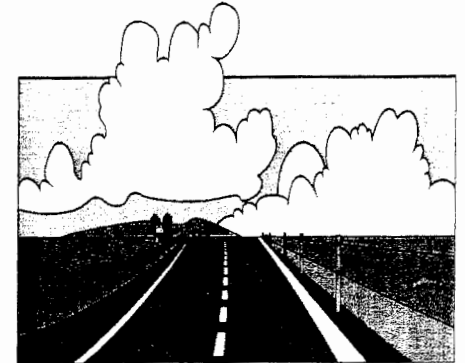

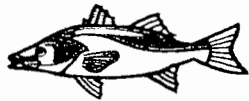

BOARDMAN MARINA AND RV PARK:

141 acres on the Columbia River, full RV hookups, and tent campers enjoy paved roads and paved sites. There are also paved walking/bike trails along the river's edge. Free boat launch. Picnic on beautiful Lake Umatilla. In Boardman, take Main Street north to West Marine Drive, cross over Railroad Bridge, go left and follow signs to various marina activities. For camping reservations call 888-481-7217 or 541-481-7217.

MUSIC IN THE PARK: During the summer there are 12 free outdoor concerts on the banks of the Columbia River at the Boardman Marina Park. Check with the Boardman Chamber for summer dates, 541-481-3014.

BOARDMAN FISHING: Some of the finest Walleye and Bass Fishing is done on the Columbia River in and around the Boardman Marina.



There is a Walleye Fishing Derby each year in July, and several Bass Tournaments year around. For more information contact High Desert Marine at 541-567-8419.

GAME AND WATERFOWL HUNTING:

GOLF COURSE: Wilson's Willow Run Golf Course is a 9-hole, Par 31 course. Total yardage is 3,530. From Boardman Main St go south to Wilson Rd, turn right, go 3.4 miles, parking lot on right, 541-481-4381. Closed Sun & Mon.

**OREGON TRAIL TOUR ROUTE**

**WELL SPRING:** A pioneer campsite area that displays the state's most dramatic Oregon Trail wagon ruts. The trail is in good condition. There are two Well Springs historic sites along the trail. The upper well was used mainly to water stock and the lower well was for domestic use. Take I-84 east, go to Exit 168, go south following Oregon Trail Route 17.6 miles, turn right, go 5 miles to Well Spring Rd, (road is unpaved), go 3.5 miles, turn left on Emigrant Rd, .6 mile to Well Spring exhibit.



**PIONEER CEMETERY:** After visiting Well Spring, continue on .4 mile to historical marker for Pioneer Cemetery. There are a few of the 10,000 to 20,000 pioneers that died on the Oregon Trail buried at this site.

PORT OF MORROW: Visit the historic Capt. Al James. A full tunnel stern built in 1939 for low draft and rapids navigation. She was the first of her kind to go into service on the Columbia River. The tugboat now sits permanently at the Port of Morrow. In Boardman take Main Street north to West Marine Drive, bear to the right, following signs to Port of Morrow and the Capt. Al James, about 1/2 mile. Also enjoy walking trails that lead from the tugboat to the Columbia River. For more information about the Al James call Port of Morrow, 541-481-7678.

UMATILLA NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE:

Offers wildlife observation and nature trails. Nesting area for Great Basin Canada geese and ducks. Shy long billed curlews return from Mexico each March to rear their young. Deer, raccoon, beaver, bald eagles, pelicans, burrowing owls, great blue herons and other species of birds are also spotted at the refuge. Take I-84 to Exit 168, turn left onto Hwy 730, go 4.3 miles to sign, turn left. For more information call 541-922-3232.

IRRIGON MARINA PARK:

Interpretive signs are there to commemorate the Lewis and Clark Expedition along the Columbia River. Irrigon Marina is one of those places that had lots of sandbars and small islands which provided seasonal homes to the natives. Take I-84 E from Boardman, Exit 168 onto Hwy 730, go 9 miles to Irrigon OR. Follow signs to marina, 4 blocks from Hwy 730.
